

Rarely Seen Views of Theodore Roosevelt’s Sagamore Hill Exhibit: On view through Feb. 22. Free Community Photography Workshop on Saturday, Feb. 22, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Wallace Center (Roosevelt-Vanderbilt National Historic Sites), Hyde Park. The Wallace Visitor and Education Center at the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum, in Hyde Park, opens the new year with selections from the photographic series Theodore Roosevelt – “How I Love Sagamore Hill” by Xiomáro. The New York artist, also known as “X”, was commissioned by the National Park Service to photograph the interiors of the president’s house at what is now Sagamore Hill National Historic Site. The series was created during the removal of the mansion’s contents and furnishings as part of a three-year, \$7.2 million structural rehabilitation. The two large photographs featured in the free exhibit are drawn from a more extensive exhibit on display at Harvard University to coincide with filmmaker Ken Burns’ 2014 release of *The Roosevelts*, which explores the political dynasty of TR, FDR and Eleanor Roosevelt.
