Currently, Xio has an exhibit at New York City's Fraunces Tavern Museum in New York City, which is being extended into 2014. The photographs center on the Long Island home of William Floyd, a Founding Father who signed the Declaration of Independence and served with George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and James Madison. The William Floyd collection includes a series that memorializes the forgotten slaves buried at Floyd's plantation. These photographs will be exhibited at the African Burial Ground National Monument in New York City starting in February 2014 (Black History month). The photographs will make their debut at the African American Museum next month through January 2014.
