Commissioned by the National Park Service, Xio looks at the little known slave burial ground on the estate of William Floyd, who signed the Declaration of Independence. Undated wooden crosses bearing generic slave names are set apart on the other side of a fence from the elaborate individualized stones of the Floyd family cemetery. The photographs serve as spiritual memorials to both the enslaved and paid laborers of color on the estate.
